Foundation courses are designed for the student who has been challenged by traditional comprehensive courses or needs to fill gaps in their academic record. This academic option takes advantage of the unique benefits of online learning to help students build study skills and knowledge in an individualized, personalized, supported environment. Foundation courses may fulfill core or elective requirements.

Comprehensive, or core, courses are designed for the high school student who has experienced success in school. They are appropriate for students who are looking to continue on to college or who plan to enter a vocation upon graduation with the academic skills they need to succeed in life. Core courses fulfill graduation requirements.

Elective courses are courses designed for students across all academic abilities to explore particular interests or to further knowledge in a particular subject area; these courses meet the electives graduation requirement. (Some core courses may also satisfy the electives requirement but only after all core requirements have been completed.)

Honors courses are designed for the high-achieving, well-prepared, college-bound student who is willing to invest substantial time and effort in academic coursework and enjoys working with other students with the same interests, ambitions, and abilities. Unless otherwise noted, Honors courses fulfill core requirements.

Advanced Placement courses are the most academically-intensive courses designed for the student who has had comprehensive success in the course prerequisites and wishes to continue on to a competitive college or university. AP courses will prepare the student for the AP exam and may give the student the opportunity to earn college credit while in high school. Unless otherwise noted, AP courses fulfill core requirements.

Online Placement Tool

To provide guidance in course selection, students take the Scantron online placement assessments in Reading, Mathematics, and Language Arts. These placement assessments not only serve as a guide for course placement, but they also assist in determining learning strengths and areas of opportunity. Students will receive Scantron instructions and credentials by email as part of the registration process. Within a week of taking the placement assessments, results and recommendations for course selection will be sent to the student's parent/guardian.
